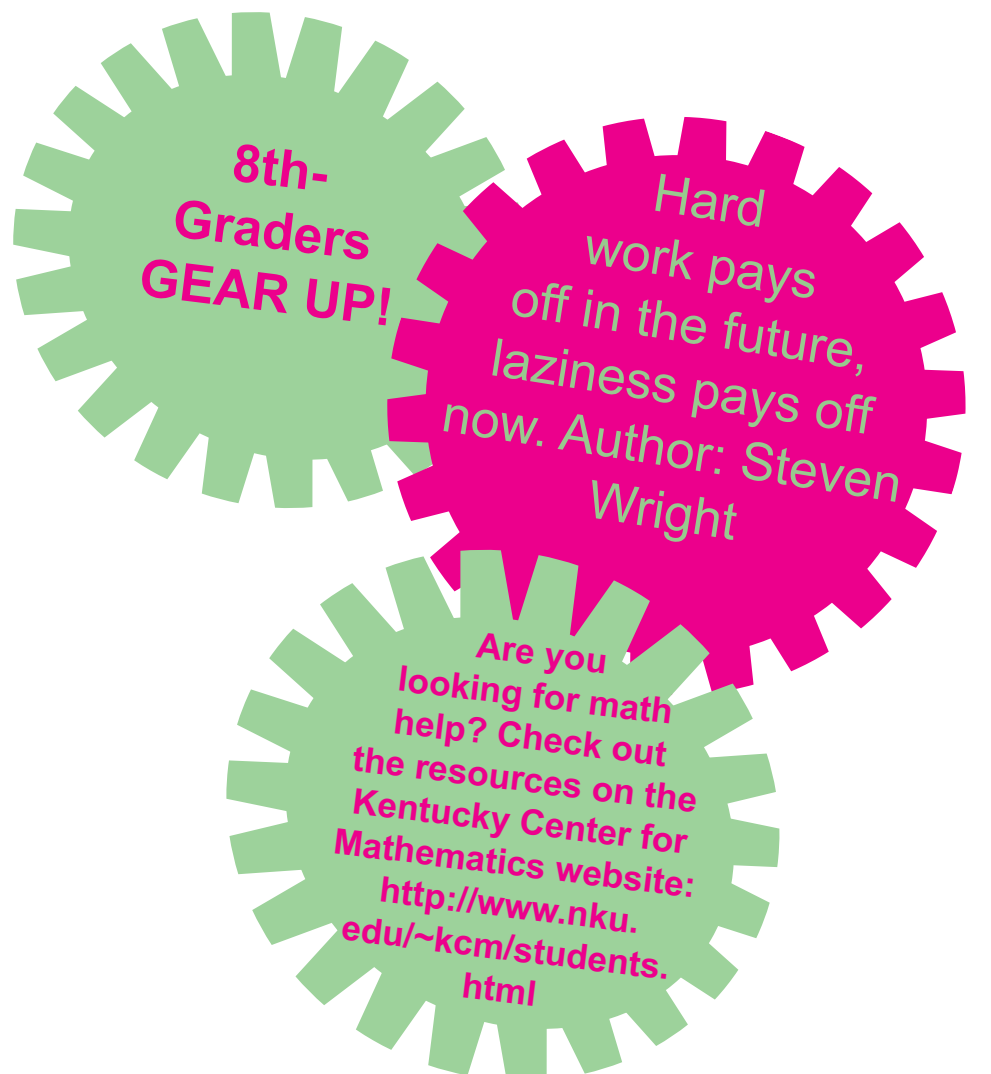


Scavenger Hunt

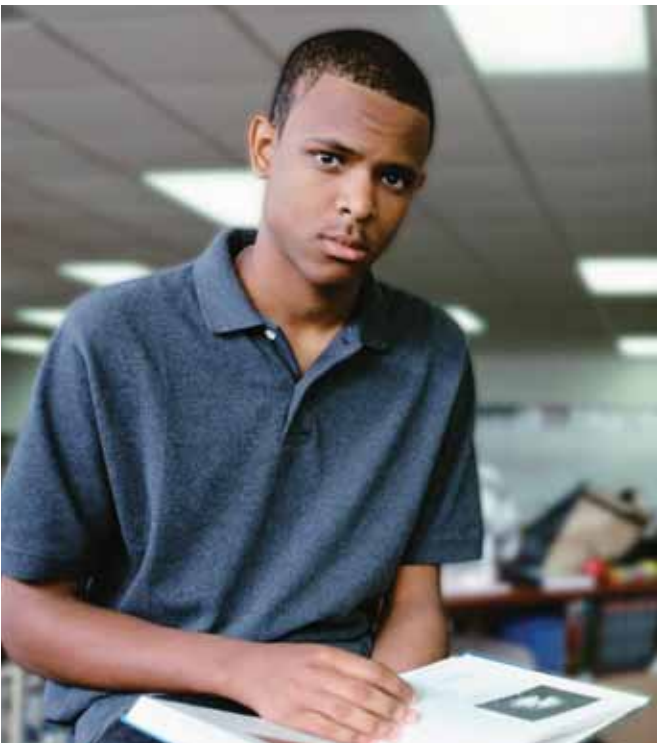
